Murray Bridge Township

The Murray River is indeed a popular tourist attraction within South Australia, but amongst its many well recognised cities, one stands out above the rest. Murray Bridge is the “crown” of the Murray Region, containing many attractions and services for people of all ages.

The Murray River is a picturesque site of house boats, paddle-steamers and happy, relaxed people. Visit award winning attractions, go shopping, sample famous wines, stock up on local produce or learn about the Murray Rivers’ fascinating heritage at a local museum. Embrace the Murraylands’ farming, horticulture and dairy industries; take a ride aboard a historic paddle steamer; check out the work of local and indigenous artists at a gallery; or take a bushwalk and discover abundant native wildlife in one of the region’s many conservation parks. Visit nearby Monarto, home of the world’s largest Open Range Zoo.

Venue Rules

1. No dogs are allowed at the Showgrounds.
2. Approved Safety Helmets must be worn at all times when riding.
3. The Cross Country Course is off limits except for the actual Eventing Championship events.
4. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited.
5. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited.
6. Bridle numbers must be visible on horses at all times.
7. Stallions are ineligible for the PCA Championships. If there are stallions on the grounds during the Championship, they must at all times be in the control of a person aged eighteen years or more, when led or ridden.
8. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times.
9. Power leads must not run over roadways.
10. Construction of tape yards or electric wire is prohibited.
11. Please observe all signs at the venue.
12. ALL horses MUST be placed in a stable or yard while they are on the ground during the competition. There are to be no horses tied to floats or trucks.
13. No infrastructure to be erected on the grounds without written approval by management prior to the event.
14. Athletes, Managers and supporters are to obey any directions as issued by the Organising Committee, Stable Manager or any member of the Murray Bridge Show Committee.



General Regulations

Dressage, Showjumping Eventing & Tetrathlon

Age Groups – As of January 1st in the year of competition

- Juniors – 12 & Under 17 years and a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Seniors – 17 & Under 26 years and a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Each State/Territory are permitted to enter six riders in each age group in each discipline (Dressage, Showjumping, Eventing & Tetrathlon)
- Teams to be a minimum of three riders and a maximum of six riders
- Teams – top three scores to count – all riders are considered to be the team
- Points are accumulated from each event
- All competitors will be scored for Individual Championships
- A minimum of three states will be needed to constitute a National Teams Championship event otherwise the event will become a competition for individuals only.

Prince Phillip Mounted Games

Age Groups – As of January 1st in the year of competition

- Juniors – will not have attained their 16th birthday by January 1st
- Seniors – 16 & Under 26 (year in which a rider obtains 25 years of age) and current PC Members (subject to State/Territory Rules)
- Each State/Territory permitted one team of five athletes in each age group for Prince Phillip Mounted Games.

Riders may participate in Dressage and one other discipline. Riders may participate in one Jumping Discipline and either the Tetrathlon or Dressage.

Due to the timetable, it is not recommended but it is at the individual State/Territory's discretion.

Substitutes, due to injury or illness will be at the discretion of each State/Territory up until the commencement of competition of the discipline entered and horse must have passed the veterinary check (Trot Up).

Competitions and Awards

JUNIOR and SENIOR competitions will be held for the following disciplines:

- Dressage
- Showjumping
- Eventing
- Prince Phillip Mounted Games
- Tetrathlon



Dressage

Junior

- Warm Up Event – EA Novice 2.2
- First Championship Event – EA Novice 2.3
- Second Championship Event – EA Elementary 3.1

Senior

- Warm Up Event – EA Elementary 3.1
- First Championship Event – EA Elementary 3.2
- Second Championship Event – EA Elementary 3.3

Invitational Medium 4.1 (not a Championship event, and not part of the Team Scoring)

Scoring - Individual

1. The number of riders starting in the first test will determine the point allocations for the subsequent tests. The warm up test will not be scored towards the accumulated Championship points, but will be scored individually for both Team and Individual.
e.g. – if 22 riders start in the first test, the scoring system for the second test is based on 22 riders and if only 20 riders start the second the scoring system remains at 22.
2. The winner of each test will be awarded points equal to the number of riders in the first test e.g. – 22 starters = 22 points
3. Each rider who completes a test will score points according to their placing in the field.
e.g.

<i>1st place</i>	<i>= 22 points</i>
<i>2nd place</i>	<i>= 21 points</i>
<i>3rd place</i>	<i>= 20 points</i>
<i>21st place</i>	<i>= 2 points</i>
<i>22nd place</i>	<i>= 1 point</i>
4. If a rider is eliminated in a test they will not be awarded points for that test. However, they are eligible to score points in other tests.
5. Equal placings will be separated for each dressage test.
 - a. The higher total collective marks will decide the higher placing.
 - b. If these marks are equal, then placing remains tied.
6. Points awarded at the completion of each test will be totalled to determine the final results of the Individual Championships.
7. In the event of an equality of the total points at the completion of the tests comprising the Championships, the rider who obtained the highest point score in the most difficult test will be outright winner or higher place getter. As follows:
 - a. Highest score in the highest numbered test.
 - b. If these scores are equal, places will be determined as for the single test competition, using the highest numbered test.

- c. If there is still a tie this process is repeated with the next higher numbered test until a winner is determined or until there are no further tests to compare, in which case the placing remains tied.
8. If a placing is tied in either dressage section and cannot be split after applying the countback system, the points for the tied placings are added together and divided by the number of tied competitors.
9. A competitor must have ridden all Championship tests to be eligible for an award.

Scoring – Team

The final placings of each test are established by ranking riders according to the dressage scores gained and then allocating the corresponding points as per the individual scoring. Taking the three highest scores the aggregate point scores for each team member are added to give the final team score.

Each team member must ride all Championship tests before the team is eligible for an award.

1. If an equal place exists in any section, the process for “Separating Equality of Scores of Teams” will be applied:
 - a. In the case of equality of points, the higher placed team is the one whose lowest classified competitor of the three scores to count has the best result.
 - b. If these figures are equal, the placing remains tied.
2. Teams of three are eligible for a team award.
3. If one or more of these three riders are eliminated then the Team is ineligible for a Team award.
4. Teams with less than three team members may ride and each member may be eligible for an Individual award but are not eligible for a Team award.

Awards

- Ribbons – Awarded individually to 5th place in each competition including the Warm up event
- Sashes to 5th place for overall Individual Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Sashes to 3rd place for overall Team Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Medals to 3rd place overall for Champion Individuals and Teams
- Rugs may be awarded for Individual Champions and Champion Team



Showjumping

Junior & Senior

- Warm Up Event – Article 238.2.2 & 245.3
- First Championship Event – Table C Article 239
- Second Championship Event – Article 238.2.2
- Third Championship Event – Two Rounds; Article 273.3.2
- Open Six Bar – Ponies and Horses

Heights

Junior – Maximum start height of First Championship event 1.05m

Senior – Maximum start height of First Championship event 1.10m

Scoring - Individual

Step 1: Determine the Individual placings for each event according to the class articles.

Step 2: Use the Points System to allocate the corresponding points to each rider.

1. The placing of an Individual Rider is decided according to the table in use and the instructions of the general program for the competition or amendments noted on the course plan.
2. Any Rider who has no chance of being placed may, at the discretion of the Ground Jury, be stopped at any time during their round.
3. Riders who are unable to complete the first round of a competition have no right to any prize, except in certain special circumstances.
4. Place getters of qualifying competitions retain the prizes they have won even if they decline to take part in the final competition for which they have qualified.
5. All place getters must take part in the presentation ceremony and should do so with the placed horses. The Judge, however, for safety reasons, may make exceptions. If a place getter fails, without plausible excuse, to take part at the presentation ceremony, the Judge, at their discretion, may decide to withhold their trophy.
6. With the exception of horse rugs presented by sponsors of competitions, rugs may not be worn at prize-giving ceremonies.

Points System

1. The number of riders starting in the first class will determine the point allocations for the subsequent classes.
e.g. – If 22 riders start in the first class, the scoring system for the subsequent classes are based on 22 riders. If only 20 riders start the second class the scoring system remains at 22 and so on.
2. The winner of each class will be awarded points equal to the number of riders in the first class. E.g. – 22 starters = 22 points
3. Every rider that completes a class will score points according to their placing in their field:

<i>E.g. -</i>	<i>1st place</i>	<i>= 22 points</i>
	<i>2nd place</i>	<i>= 21 points (22-1)</i>
	<i>3rd place</i>	<i>= 20 points</i>
	<i>22nd place</i>	<i>= 1 point</i>

4. If a rider is eliminated in a class they will not be awarded points for that class. However, they are eligible to score points in the other classes.
5. These individual rider points for each class are added together progressively throughout the day to determine the overall individual award.
6. In the event of an equal placing in the qualifying rounds, the scores will be added together and divided equally.

Scoring – Team

1. Teams may consist of three to six riders with the best three scores to count. In order to be eligible for a team placing at least three members of the Team must complete each scheduled class.
2. At least three Team Members must complete a Class for the Team to post a score in that class.
3. Points obtained by the three highest placed riders in each Team for each class are totalled for that class.
4. In the case of the equality of points for the final placing, the scores will be added and divided equally. If these are still equal then the placings are tied.
5. If a rider is eliminated which would preclude the team from obtaining a team score, then the eliminated rider can continue for the team (receiving 20 penalties than the worst placed competitor who has finished that particular round), thereby enabling the team to be scored in the following way:
 - a. If the team is a two round event then the rider carries that score into the next round.
 - b. If the team event is for example an AM5 then the score obtained by the above method becomes the rider's team score.

Note: Riders in the team obtain individual points in the usual way. An individual rider (who is also part of a team) eliminated in the competition, can continue to be scored for the team, but not for the individual. i.e. – may continue into the next round for the team with faults as above.

6. Teams with less than three team members may ride but are ineligible for a team score.

Awards

- Ribbons – Awarded individually to 5th place in each competition including the Warm up event
- Sashes to 5th place for overall Individual Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Sashes to 3rd place for overall Team Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Medals to 3rd place overall for Champion Individuals and Teams

Scoring - Individual

Individual scoring shall be as per the Eventing rules.

The same rider must complete all three tests mounted on the same horse

1. Disqualification or elimination from one test involves disqualification or elimination from the whole competition.
2. The classification is reached by adding together all the penalty points incurred in the different tests.
3. Scoring of Individual Champion to be calculated from the three Championship phases. The winner is the competitor with the lowest total penalty points.
4. In the case of a tie, the winner or place getter will be the one with the best Cross Country obstacle score (total of jumping and time penalties)
5. If there is still a tie, the winner or place getter will be the one whose Cross Country time was the closest to optimum time.
6. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the competitor with the best score in the Jumping test (time and obstacles)
7. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the competitor with the best time (fastest) in the Jumping test.
8. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the competitor with the best percentage score in the Dressage test. If there is still equality, the tie will remain in the final classification.

Scoring – Team

1. For scoring purposes, the “Team” shall be defined as the three riders with the lowest penalties after all tests have been scored
2. The winning Team for Eventing will be that Team which scores the lowest total of penalties accumulated across all three tests.
3. In the case of a tie for 1st place or any other place, the higher placing Team will be that one with the lowest penalties in the Cross Country obstacle score (total jumping and time penalties).
4. If there is still a tie, the higher placing Team will be that one whose Cross Country time was closest to the optimum time.
5. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the Team with the best score in the Jumping test (jumping and obstacle).
6. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the Team with the best time (fastest) in the Jumping test.
7. If there is still equality, the classification will be decided in favour of the Team with the best percentage score in the Dressage test. If there is still equality, then the tie will remain in the final classification.

Awards

- Ribbons – Awarded individually to 5th place in the Warm up Dressage Test and Showjumping
- Sashes to 5th place for overall Individual Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Sashes to 3rd place for overall Team Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Medals to 3rd place overall for Champion Individuals and Teams
- Rugs may be awarded for Individual Champions and Champion Team

Tetrathlon

Junior & Senior

Four phase competition including:

- Run – 1500m
 - Optimum time 5 minutes 40 seconds
- Swim – 4 minutes
 - Points scored for each metre swum
- Shooting – Air Pistols
 - Specified targets on a 10m shooting range
 - Must have completed some basic firearms training in the handling of an air pistol at an approved provider and be able to provide proof of completion
- Riding – Showjumping Derby Course
 - 85cm
 - 12 – 14 obstacles with 2 doubles
 - Gate and Slip Rail
 - Speed 325mpm

Scoring

Competitors score positive points according to the standard of their performance in each phase. In the Running and Riding Phases, they are based on the standards of 1,000 and 1,400 respectively, competitors having marks deducted or, in the Running, bonus marks added, according to their performance compared to the standard. In the Shooting and Swimming Phases, positive marks are awarded for shots on target and distances swum and on scales such that scores are commensurate with those of other phases.

- The scores of a competitor in each of the four phases are added together to give an overall score for the competitor.
- To earn an overall score a competitor must start or attempt to start each phase and must continue until eliminated or compelled to retire because of an accident, or exhaustion of themselves or their horse.
- A competitor who fails to follow the above rule will, unless granted exemption by the organiser and the Official Technical Delegate, score zero for their overall score and will not be eligible for any awards.

Awards

- Sashes to 5th place for overall Individual Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Sashes to 3rd place for Team Championship – 1st place to receive a Tri-coloured Champion Sash
- Medals to 3rd place overall for Champion Individuals and Teams
- Rugs may be awarded for Individual Champions and Champion Team



Stabling, Camping and Extras

Stabling and Camping at the Showgrounds

Stabling and Yards

There will be 150 stables available at the Showgrounds and these will be allocated on a pro-rata basis to each state. Stabling will be booked through your state's entry. Bedding will be provided in the price of each stable and extra may be added as required at no extra cost.

There will also be 50 yards available on site for the Championships, which will be situated near the stables.

A Stable Manager will be on duty for the duration of the event and any queries regarding stabling should be directed to this person.

Stable Cost:	\$350 plus GST for the duration of the event.
Yard Cost:	\$200 plus GST for the duration of the event
Bond:	\$100 (to be returned when yards are cleaned and checked)

Stables and yards will be available before the competition, please indicate on the entry form when you will be arriving.

Camping

Powered and unpowered sites will be available for riders and families to utilise during the event. There will be powered sites allocated for trucks and floats, and sites allocated for campers, caravans, etc.
